Dear Parents and Carers,

We have all had a super week this week and we have also managed to use the field on dryer days, which has added to the fun. The children's learning is well under way and I have seen some amazing pieces of work across all areas of the curriculum this week.

### **Forest School**

As we have super grounds that are not always used to the fullest, I have arranged for forest school sessions to be incorporated in to our curriculum. For those parents and carers who aren't familiar with forest school learning, it is a way to enrich the day-to- day life of pupils by using the outdoor environment, for example, the children are going to be taught how to use different ropes, make camp fires and also use the trees and bushes to den build, using a child-centred approach to learning. The children will be taught by a trained Forest School level 3 practitioner. For this term, Year 3 children and Y4 children will be attending forest school and then the classes will swap after Christmas, to ensure that all children throughout the year have learning outside of the classroom.

## **Holiday requests**

I have received a number of term time holiday requests in the past month and want to be as transparent as possible with you as parents about the authorisation of these holidays. The new guidance that came in to effect on the 19<sup>th</sup> August is very clear that **term time holidays will not be authorised** unless they are for exceptional circumstances. I have also attended a network meeting this week about Penalty Notices- fines generated from the Local Authority if parents/carers take their children out of school on holiday during term time.

The updates are as follows:

- School do not receive any of the money that comes from the Local Authority issuing a fine.
- A Penalty notice can be issued for less than 10 sessions (5 days) if a holiday is taken.
- If parents/carers choose to take their children out of school and the day's overlap with inset days'/bank holidays, but the children come in to school having missed some days of school, a Penalty notice may be issued.

- Penalty notices issued will increase if holidays are taken over a period of 3 years.
- Penalty notices can also be issued for irregular attendance.

### **Attendance winners**

This week's attendance winners are Reception with a wonderful 100% attendance, in 2<sup>nd</sup> place are Y4 with 99.3% and in 3<sup>rd</sup> place are Y1 with 97.5%. A huge well done to Reception who will get an extra playtime next week at some point!










This week the children have been listening to 'Cake' by Sue Hendra. We have enjoyed listening to the story, making play dough cakes and developing our fine motor skills by making paper chains. On Monday, we made fairy cakes after chatting about what we do to celebrate birthdays with our own families.







This week, Year 6 continue to learn about the famous British artist L.S. Lowry and his iconic "matchstick people" paintings. These simple, yet expressive figures are central to Lowry's depictions of industrial life in northern England. As part of our art lessons, we have been exploring various **techniques** to recreate his unique style. We used wooden tools, paint brushes, straws and fingers to experiment with the minimalist, yet detailed nature of Lowry's work. Through these different techniques, the children have been learning how to convey emotion and movement with simple forms, while also gaining a deeper understanding of **composition** and **perspective** in art. Alongside their practical work, they have discussed how Lowry's paintings captured everyday life in the 20th century, focusing on industrial scenes, landscapes, and the people who lived and worked there.





This week in Geography, Year 2 explored routes, what they are and why people use them. The children used their local area maps to plan a simple route to a point of interest or landmark of their choice, taking account of road names and places on their journey. The children also became familiar with the four points of a compass and used these to describe their route, alongside road names and places that they passed.

Class 1 have been preparing for their art project on collages. They have practised tearing, cutting, gluing and overlapping a variety of materials in their skills development session and through continuous provision. We can't wait to see the final pieces!





This week in Year 3, we have been exploring main and subordinate clauses. The children have been working practically to match the subordinate clause to the main clause making some fun, silly sentences. The children have then applied this in their own writing making sure to use subordinating conjunctions, well done Year 3!

This week in art, the Year 5 children have been continuing to practice their collage skills. They have been learning how to create shade as well as texture by overlapping materials. Here are some amazing examples.





In Nursery Class this week we have started on our Autumn crafts. Painting pictures of autumn and all the children enjoyed conker rolling using different shaped tins and paper, making some lovely autumnal patterns as the conkers rolled side to side and front to back. Later in the week we played "Kim's Game" (memory game) where the children were given a tray of items that rolled and those that didn't. The children had to remember what was on the tray when a member of staff took one away. We then investigated what items roll and those that didn't.
