


Class 1 have been sequencing events from the book Meesha Makes Friends and completing a plan to prepare for next week's diary writing, from the perspective of Meesha.

This week in Science, Year 2 have been learning about Seeds and Bulbs. The children have enjoyed learning about the similarities and differences between them and have completed some STEM sentences to show what they have learnt. Well done Year 2!



Year 6 has been diving into the world of perspective in our art lessons this week, by studying the iconic L.S. Lowry painting *The Fever Van* (1935). Lowry's distinctive style, known for its industrial landscapes and "matchstick" figures, has provided the perfect inspiration for the students to explore depth and dimension in their drawings.

Using *The Fever Van* as a reference, the children focused on capturing the mood and atmosphere of the piece, while applying techniques to show distance and proportion. It has been a fantastic opportunity for Year 6 to combine their creativity with technical skills, bringing the busy streets of Lowry's world to life on paper. This week in Year 3 we celebrated mental health and well-being by wearing yellow; we discussed what it is and how we can look after our own well-being. Furthermore, in Spanish, we made fortune tellers; the children LOVED making them and applying their own Spanish knowledge to create their own craft.







In nursery class this week we have enjoyed our very own homemade, warm vegetable soup, the children chopped a variety of vegetables ready to go in our soup maker.
